From the Ministers' desk. A message from Bill and Catherine's office.

At our last Body and Soul event, I (Catherine) talked about the time I went hiking in Spain. My friend and I had an incredible summer adventure. We walked through vineyards, abundant with growth and promise. We smelled the fragrance of the most beautiful roses I have ever seen. We traveled beside crazy-busy highways, where we feared for our safety at times, and we wandered through quiet towns, stopping to pray and light candles in churches that were hundreds of years old. We got lost a lot, too.

Whenever you travel, you have to rely on the kindness of strangers. Many times on this trip, we had to ask for help. From the simple act of needing to make a phone call, to getting directions to the next town, or ordering a "café con leche" in a local restaurant, we were forced to put ourselves into the care of others. People were so very kind. I re-discovered the kindness of strangers, and I came home determined to be kinder myself.

When I need reminders of my promise to be kinder, the wisdom contained in Hebrews 13:2 comes to mind: "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it."

This summer, wherever you travel, be it on the streets of Sudbury, or further afield, may you find kindness and bring back stories to tell of how you welcomed the hospitality of strangers. Perhaps these holy encounters will help you to learn a bit more about the love of God,

surrounding us, prodding us, and blessing the living of our days.

And I will look for kindness on the dock in Little Current, near our cottage, as I enjoy both the summer sunshine and ice cream, the staples of Island living.

Stewardship Reflections - Spring 2015

Stewardship is everything that we think, say, and do after we say "I believe."

When many church members hear the word "Stewardship", they think of pledge campaigns, financial reports, budget deficits and other money matters. However, Stewardship involves much more than just the financial side of the church's work.

Time and **Talent** are gifts we receive from God to nurture and share throughout our days. We encourage you to consider how you might share your gifts to support the work of the church. For example...

Time is a scarce and finite resource. In our lives of faith, how we spend our time is one way to indicate what we value.

- How do you "give" time to the service of others, formally and informally?
- How does your time inventory reveal your faith and love of God?

Talent - How to employ our gifts in God's service is an ongoing Christian spiritual practice.

- Consider the things you do well and are willing to share, things that you are excited to begin once asked. Once you have discerned your talents, how will you use them to serve our congregation and the wider community?

By ensuring your uninterrupted financial support of the church, even if you are absent for just a few summer Sundays, you help to keep the church from dipping into its reserves to meet our expenses. You'll also have fewer offerings to "catch up" on when we return to worship at St. Andrew's on September 6th.
