We again breathe, as we light this candle. We prepare for worship. We come with Joy, a sense of anticipation of God's Grace. We come seeking Spirit's presence with us. We invite holy light, seeking guidance, wisdom, courage on our journey. *[light candle]*

Nurturing Safe Space

We seek Holy Spirit and Love to help us nurture safe space in this place where all can participate in worship and life regardless of age, ability, race, cultural background, sexual orientation, or gender identity.

Acknowledging Traditional Territory

For millennia, this land we live on has been cared for by First Peoples. When Europeans came to this land, and church communities formed, the people already caring for this land had wisdom and spirituality that we did not appreciate. Instead of listening and learning, we imposed our vision of civilization as a condition of accepting the gospel. We are grateful to be allowed to use these lands for growing spiritually and worshipping. We acknowledge and pay respect to the Indigenous, the Métis, ancestors of this particular land, particularly those of the Wahnapitae First Nation and the Atikemeksheng Anishnawbek. Let us work earnestly for Reconciliation.

Praying for Grace and Assurance

As we prayerfully enter worship, let us consider quietly:

Time and again in the Bible, God's children venture away from their spiritual centre – each time, prophets call them to turn around and to follow God's voice back. When in the past week have we wandered away from our spiritual centre? How did we respond? [Silence... play singing bowl]

Help us to come home to your love.

Rejoice! With Joy in our hearts we celebrate how God calls us home.

God's vision of love calls all Creation home, in justice and peace.

The Prayer Jesus Taught

This we pray along with the prayer taught to us by beloved who loved, and called us to love too,

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kin-dom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kin-dom, the power and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

Time Up Front

John was wild, you just never knew what he would say. He spent a lot of time out in the wilderness, way outside of town, teaching about God's ways. He also preached by the water, about how God was coming soon to make things right in the world.

I wonder where he slept. I wonder if he ever got invited to people's houses. What do you think?

The water (splash in water of the font/or fountain). He had big crowds as he baptized people – down into the water. People were nervous when they went into the water with John. Down they would go, take a deep breath. Up – We are new. Have you ever gone under water? Do you remember when you first held your breath and went under? You come up and think – I did it!

Such excitement in the crowd. Do you think people gossiped about John? I wonder what they would say. What would you ask John if you could ask him a question? What do you think John would say to us, here, about living in God's way?

This is a repeat after me prayer: God of surprises: You call us to love; You call us to be fair, to share; You call us to listen for your voice. Make this world right, God. May we be your helpers. Amen.

Waiting for the Promised One - Based on Luke 3:7-18

John shouted in the wilderness, hoping that the people would hear. And they did hear. And they came to him in crowds, surrounding him where he made his home, in the wild next to the Jordan River. "It's not that easy, you know!" John shouted. "If you want to change, you need to have something to show for it. It doesn't matter who your family is. It doesn't matter where you come from. Your life is like a tree; if it's not producing fruit for the world to enjoy, then you may as well chop it all down."

The crowds were intrigued. "OK then. If that stuff doesn't matter, then what does? John, what should we do?"

"Do you have extra clothes? Extra food? Give them away!" John said. "Do you collect taxes? Well, don't collect too much; you're not supposed to steal. Do you serve in the army? Then just do your job; don't try to scare people by being cruel."

These answers felt right to the people. They wondered in their hearts if John might be the Messiah, the one God had promised. "No, no, no. I am not God's chosen one, God's Messiah," John said. "I baptize with water, but someone is coming who will baptize with the spirit of God. The promised one will sort everything out, gathering up what needs to be kept and burning away everything that will only get in the way."

The people welcomed this news. But King Herod did not. King Herod shut John up in prison. And the people waited to see when the promised one would appear.

Let us pray: God of rejoicing, we ground ourselves in your promise that righteousness and justice will prevail. Guide us begin another week, trying live lives of love, peace, and integrity. Show us ways to share the good news we hear today with those we meet. Amen

May those who have power in our world, those who have money, use their blessings to especially help those who don't have money or power. Bring peace to those in hospitals, in fire stations, police stations, bless them as they continue to work so hard, and take risks for the community. Bless those who work in stores, so that we can get the food and important things to survive – keep them well.
