Acknowledging Traditional Territory

Here we are worshiping on the traditional land of the First Peoples. Across Turtle Island, Treaties were made between colonizers and those who had lived on the land for millennia. Here at St. Andrew's, we give thanks to the Wahnapitae First Nation and to the Atikameksheng Anishnawbek, this land where the Robinson Huron Treaty was made in 1850, and never honoured by Canada.

We have a responsibility implied by those ancient and sacred Treaties to share the caretaking of this land with Indigenous neighbours. We give thanks for the current and historic contributions that First Nations and Métis people have made. May we journey and act together towards reconciliation.

Baptism

The sacrament of baptism proclaims and celebrates the grace of God. By water and the Spirit, we are called, claimed, and commissioned: we are called God's own, welcomed as children of God; we are claimed by Christ, united with Christ, united with one another and the Christ community of every time and place; we are commissioned to Christ's ministry of love, peace and justice, and strengthened by the Holy Spirit for the work of the church in the world.

Dear Paul used the metaphor of our Christian Community being like a Body in Christ in his ancient letter. He said that every body part has an importance, each different, but equally important. An arm can't tell an eye, for example, "I am of more importance than you."

Imagine if a Body was all hands or all heads. That would look strange, and would not be able to function. In the same way, our Body needs diversity, different people with different talents and passions. Today we celebrate this.
