## Time Up Front – Following the Star

Dave, with a basic star in his hand, talks about the Magi following the Star to Bethlehem, that they have been guided to see the Christ child. A very strange sight for them, they were from a different country and faith tradition. But they followed in faith, and were amazed.

Finding Jesus. That's what the star shows us. Ok, how about we follow the star.

*Dave to Pulpit* – This is where people speak, stories are shared at these microphones, Jesus is found in Scriptures, in preaching in praying.

*Dave to Communion Table* – This is a Table set for Communion, that joins us and all followers of Jesus. We are connected by Christ.

**Dave to front of Tech Booth** – this is how we share this worship with many people in their homes, at work. We are connected by Christ, we find Christ through the ministry of Roger and Mallon and all our volunteers.

*Dave to the Piano/Choir* – This is where beautiful music is played and sung. We find Christ in the sacred music, as we hum and dance and sing.

*Dave to the centre aisle* – This is where we really find Jesus, in our midst. I find Jesus in (name & name). Jesus is found in each of us, in the things we say and do.

## Scripture Reading (Freda Wilson)

## "Gifts for Jesus" – A Paraphrase based Matthew 2:1-12

The magi, the wise people of their lands, saw the star in the night sky. They knew it was an important sign that the child of God had been born and that they needed to go and visit and worship the child.

But they wondered exactly where the child was. They went to the ruler of the land, Herod by name, and asked him where they could find the child. Herod sent for all his advisers, the priests, and the scribes who wrote down all the important things about the rules of the land. They told Herod that the prophets from long ago mentioned that the new ruler sent from God would be born in the little town of Bethlehem in a part of the country called Judea.

They also said that the child would become like a shepherd and take care of God's people. Herod wanted to know exactly when the star had shown up in the sky and brought in the magi and asked them. Herod told the magi to go to Bethlehem and look everywhere for the child. Herod also told them to send a message when they found the child. Herod explained that he wanted to go and worship the child, too. Herod was jealous though, and might have been planning to hurt the child to prevent it from becoming the land's new ruler. After Herod talked to the magi, they left and saw the star moving in the night sky. They followed it until it stopped. They saw a small house there and were very happy to have finally found the right place. They went in and saw Mary and the child; they bowed down and worshipped and gave the child special gifts. The gifts were gold and expensive oils and perfumes.

That night a dream warned that they shouldn't go back to Herod, but they should return home a different way. That way, Herod wouldn't know exactly where the child was.
