Nurturing Safe Space

Each and every one of us is welcome in this space. Whether you feel joy or sadness today, feeling together or scattered, confident or questioning, you are welcome. Acknowledging Traditional Territory

We are gathered today to worship on land that is the Traditional territory of the Atikemeksheng Anishnawbek and the Wahnapitae First Nation. For thousands of years, First Peoples have lived on this land, honouring the Creator and living with respect for creation. But Christianity came to this land, not to love unconditionally, but to conform the land and its Indigenous peoples to a skewed vision of God and Christ. As we acknowledge Indigenous sisters and brothers and give thanks for their stewardship of the land and its plants and animals, the lakes and streams with their life forms, we accept our responsibility as Church and as people of faith to rebuild trust, healing and Right Relations.

Call to Worship

Today is Pentecost! The day when God's Spirit called us to go out to the world and love, love, love each other. The fire was laid upon all disciples to go, to not stay hiding in a room, or anywhere else. It's simple enough to think about, but the doing is harder.
