We ask now for the presence of your Holy Spirit: come to us as wind and fire, as bubbling laughter, as healing touch, or as the still small voice of peace. May we grow into living with respect on this land, seeking reconciliation through peace and friendship, while honouring Indigenous ancestors who cherished this land. We pray for the Holy Spirit to breathe healing, justice, hope, and compassion into all our relations and set us free from the harmful thoughts and actions of colonization.

Call to Worship

In the name of the Creator, the fountain of life, the name of Christ, the pulse of life, and the name of the Spirit, the breath of life,

Holy! Holy! Holy!

Earth is filled with Creator's presence.

Christ, you are indeed with us in this sanctuary we call Earth,

A planet filled with your presence, quivering in the forests, vibrating in the land, pulsating in the wilderness, shimmering in the rivers, wildflowers and mysterious mushrooms, swirling grasses and goldenrods.

We invite the farmlands to sing with us: wheat fields, orchards, and vineyards, hay fields, gardens, and wetlands.

We invite the ground to stir deep below: life-giving microbes restoring the soil, beetles and worms preparing our food.

We celebrate the song of the soil! Sing, Creation, sing!

Help us to empathise with your creatures who are suffering. Lift our spirits to rejoice with the land, the flowers of the field and all the creatures of the countryside. In the name of Christ, who reconciles and renews all things in creation. Amen.

Time up Front

Some of you may have noticed that we went through a big change last week. I saw a lot of backpacks and bags on people walking around. What happened last week?

So, we were enjoying relaxing in the summer. But last week children, youth and many young and older adults started school. Many people went back to work.

A big change! Are some of you relieved? Why?

In these changes, we remember as people who follow Jesus, that God is always with us. When we are excited... when we are anxious or maybe even when we are downright scared.

So, we are going to bless your bags, your backpacks, your briefcases, whatever bag you brought today. Online, do you have a bag, a purse, a packsack that you want to have blessed? Hold it out now.

Let us pray.

First for the children, youth, and adults all going to school after relaxing vacations:

Loving God, Wise Creator, remind us that you are with us as we return to school. Give us delight, curiosity, imagination, and patience as we learn, with other students and with our teachers. Bring calm when we are afraid. And may we share your love and compassion each day as Jesus taught. Amen.

Now how about for those anxious parents entrusting their children to a new school year? God, we as parents, grandparents, neighbours, go through a range of feelings as our children goes to school. We are excited for the kids, but we also worry about the challenges they face. Bless all the students in their learning. Be especially with those children whose experience of learning in a classroom is difficult for many reasons. Bless the teachers, the administrators, and all the staff and volunteers who care for our children day by day. Help each of us to share with the children in our lives to value fairness, compassion, and community wellbeing as Jesus always did. Amen.

Thank you, God, for our teachers;... our parents and aunties and uncles and grandparents who teach us many things... Thank you for our teachers at school who are special, too... Thank you for Jesus,... who teaches us to love love love... and then to love love some more. Amen.

<u>Matthew 12:38-40</u> (The Message translation)

Here is a reading from the Gospel according to Matthew, in which Jesus debates with scholars who want proof. The real truth is revealed through faith that opens our eyes and hearts to the wonders of the Creator.

Later a few religion scholars and Pharisees cornered him. "Teacher, we want to see your credentials. Give us some hard evidence that God is in this. How about a miracle?"

Jesus said, "You're looking for proof, but you're looking for the wrong kind. All you want is something to titillate your curiosity, satisfy your lust for miracles.

The only proof you're going to get is what looks like the absence of proof: Jonah-evidence. Like Jonah, three days and nights in the fish's belly, the Son of Man will be gone three days and nights in a deep grave.

Will you pray with me: Wonderful God, we give thanks that our journey has led us here, this morning; led us to your word for each one of us, where our hearts will be filled with your love, where our minds will be shaped by your teaching, and where our souls will learn to cherish and proclaim your grace in the world. Amen.

It is right to join every creature in praising God.

It is right to give you thanks, loving Creator. Your word is the impulse for all things to be, for space, stars, and stardust to appear, for Earth to emerge from the deep, for life to be born of Earth, and for humans to be born of Earth and the Spirit.

You created human beings to be your servants on Mother Earth, to care for our garden home; you suffered when they desecrated the Earth and its waters and lands.

Your Spirit was the life impulse in all things, restoring the broken and healing the wounded, groaning in anticipation of a new creation, stirring with new life born of water and the Spirit.

You chose to be born a vulnerable human being, to become a part of your Earth; to suffer, die, and rise from the dead to be the Good News of hope for all never to give up. You restore creation time and again in the natural cycles around us, you reconcile all creatures born of Earth and the Spirit.

Your presence is the living power in all things, the Christ deep among us, filling Earth—land, sea and air; filling every element and place; filling the grain and the grape we share with you this day.

Therefore, with angels and archangels, saints and sinners, ancient voices in the forest, high voices from the sky, deep voices from the sea, and the whole company of Creation, we proclaim your presence among us.

Holy, holy, God of all life, earth and sea and sky and all things that exist are full of your presence and glorify your name.

Together, again, in response to the great mystery of this sacred meal we proclaim our faith:

Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

Together we remember that vision of God's reign shown to us in Jesus at table:

he shared food with followers and friends,

with saints and sinners.

with crowds of thousands on the hillside,

and a few friends in an upper room.

On the night before he died, he had supper with his companions.

He took a loaf of bread, and after giving thanks, he broke it, and gave it to them, saying:

"Take, eat. Do this in remembrance of me."

Then, he took a cup, and after giving thanks, he passed it among them, saying:

"Drink this. Do this in remembrance of me."

Through this loaf and cup, Jesus lives within us.

In word and deed, Jesus lives among us.

Prayers of Community

God of Mystery – God of community, Creator, Christ and Spirit - teach us to better empathise with Mother Earth within whom we are woven, intimately connected.

Make our spirits sensitive to the cries of creation, cries for justice from the land, the hills and the soil. Holy One, make our faith sensitive to the groans of the Spirit that we can hear if we listen to

Creation: The volatile weather patterns fomented by climate change. The overdevelopment of pristine land, as governments are doing, selling out nature for so-called progress. May we listen to the groans, a longing for a new creation. But may we also celebrate the healing of earth and atmosphere too. Sudbury being a great example, ravaged by mining, but also healed, thanks to partnering between mining companies, academics and government. Remind us always that it is never too late to change our lifestyle, even at the simplest level – educating ourselves and each other, and speaking up for environmental causes.

We give thanks in this quiet moment, for the many blessings we enjoy. Families and loving friends, rooves over our heads, a country that still cares for its most vulnerable, most times. Our health, good or not so good as it may be, we give thanks for health care and supports for when we are feeling ill or fragile. (silence)

We pray now for ourselves and those situations around us, and around the world of concern to us. We pray for countries disproportionately burdened by climate change, almost always countries with the least resources, and the culprits are the countries with the most resources. God, bring equity to our world, and your dream, your kin-dom, come. We offer our own personal prayers in this quiet moment. (silence)

Now I invite you to pray with me a fresh interpretation of the ancient prayer that Jesus taught...

The Prayer that Jesus Taught (VU 916)

Eternal Spirit, Earth-maker, Pain-bearer, Life-giver, Source of all that is and that shall be, Father and Mother of us all, Loving God, in whom is heaven: The hallowing of your name echo through the universe! The way of your justice be followed by the peoples of the world! Your heavenly will be done by all created beings! Your commonwealth of peace and freedom sustain our hope and come on earth. With the bread we need for today, feed us. In the hurts we absorb from one another, forgive us. In times of temptation and test, strengthen us. From trials too great to endure, spare us. From the grip of all that is evil, free us. For you reign in the glory of the power that is love, now and for ever. Amen.

Taking Communion

Come, for all things are now ready.

Come to the table with all your kin and share with all in need: the gift of healing for those in pain, the gift of forgiveness for those in sin, the gift of assurance for those in doubt, and the gift of hope for those in tears.

May we who share these gifts, share Christ with one another and with all our kin.

And when we are gathered in that place to which you will direct us at the end of time, we will join with our sisters and brothers in forever praising your glory, your love, God in Community, Holy in One. Amen.
